Recently, the annual W4Kangaroo competition took place. A number of pupils from the Eglantier also participated.

The W4Kangoeroe maths competition aims to let you experience that maths can be great fun and challenging, for everyone at their own level. It's great to get your brain working! The tests were very tough, but also a lot of fun.

Beforehand, all children from groups 3 to 8 took a practice test. The 2 or 3 best children from the class then entered the competition. After several weeks of waiting for the results, all participants received a certificate, a game and an extra prize for the highest score per class.

### **Cleaning toys for kindergarten**
