Personnel change after the May holidays

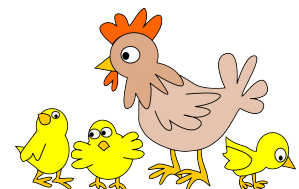

We are busy finding a suitable replacement and will keep you informed of developments. Of course we will do our best to make sure that the childcare runs as smoothly as possible.

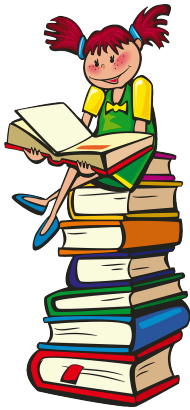
Nursery: Spring theme and vacation planning

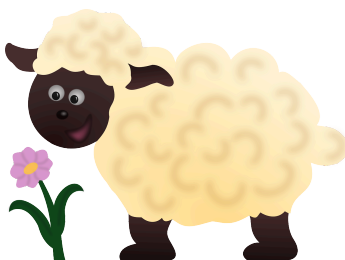
Extracurricular: Holiday program Festival Fantasia

After the test, patience was tested. And when it finally happened, the conclusion was: All students achieved a very good score.

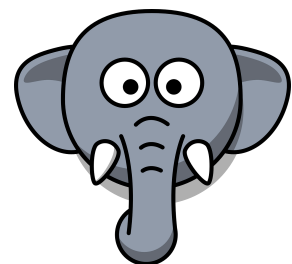
Most scores corresponded with the previously issued advice.

Adults - €65

Children up to 18 years - €20

Residents of Delft with low income - €5

Children whose parents have a €5 pass - free

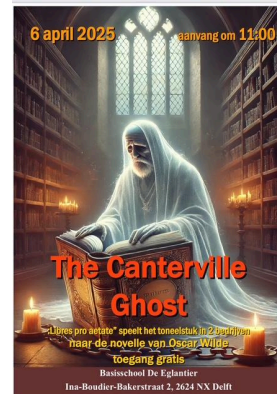
Invitation performance: The Canterville Ghost
