7:00 p.m.: End

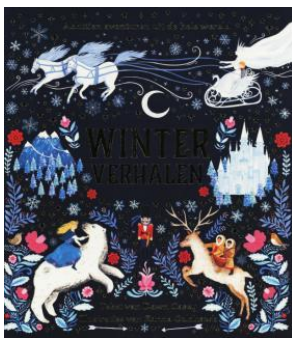
