Important dates in the upcoming period


On Wednesday 29 January, there will be an IKC study day. Education and daycare will have a joint study day on that day. This means that both school and daycare will be closed.

You can read more difficult books than your child can read themselves; good for their vocabulary.


You can talk about it together; helps with better understanding of stories and reading comprehension. What to read aloud?
